

# BASEBALL

SIGHT WORDS LESSON PLAN



## PREPARATION

1. Select the sight words flashcards that you would like to use for the game.
2. From the Lesson Plans page within the Resource Center, print the Baseball Out cards. You will need several copies.
3. You can also print out the Baseball Scoreboard from the same page. (Optional)
4. Divide the flashcards into four piles according to difficulty. The easiest pile represents singles, the next hardest pile is doubles, the next is triples and the hardest pile is homeruns.
5. Mix the Baseball Out cards into the piles of flashcards. NOTE: The singles pile should contain the fewest out cards and the homerun pile should contain the most.

## EXECUTION

1. Divide the students into two teams and select a team to "bat" first.
2. The team lines up in their "batting order" and the first student comes "up to bat". That student decides if he or she will go for a single, double, triple or homerun.
3. Take the top card from the selected pile and show it to the student.
4. If the student reads the word correctly he or she moves the selected number of bases.
5. If the student cannot read the word, or if the selected card is an out card, the team gets one out.
6. The team is "at bat" until they get 3 outs and then the other team "bats".
7. Play a designated number of innings to complete the game. The team that scores the most runs wins.
